Woodrow Wilson House Hosts 23rd Annual Kalorama House and Embassy Tour

What: Kalorama House and Embassy Tour

When: Sunday, September 16, 2007, 12:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Where: Woodrow Wilson House, 2340 S Street, NW

The Facts: The Woodrow Wilson House, a National Trust Historic Site, in the heart of Embassy Row is opening the doors and offering a rare opportunity to visit sites of diplomatic entertaining. Visitors can explore the many cultures represented by the accredited ambassadors from foreign countries who reside in the Kalorama neighborhood. The Kalorama House and Embassy Tour presented annually by the Friends of Woodrow Wilson House to benefit its educational and audience outreach programs. There will be several beautiful private homes including a house designed by Waddy B. Wood, who also designed Wilson House and a Kalorama home that has been turned into a luxury guest house. The Woodrow Wilson House

The Bonus: Visitors can also preview the Wilson House's exhibition, *The Presidential Dish: Mrs. Woodrow Wilson and the White House China Room*. This is the only U.S. showing and first exhibition to recreate the 1917 Presidential Collection Room, now known as the White House China Room.

With 150 pieces of rare presidential porcelain, the exhibition celebrates the 90th anniversary of the White House China Room created by First Lady Edith Bolling Wilson—and offers an opportunity to revisit the original Presidential Collection Room as President and Mrs. Woodrow Wilson knew it.
